About the Programme

The North East Inner City (NEIC) Initiative is a social regeneration initiative endorsed by Government involving local communities in the NEIC, businesses and statutory agencies creating opportunities to bring about lasting, positive change in the area.

Work experience has the potential to make a real difference in the lives of young people. Often, work placements can reflect and reproduce patterns of inequality with working class students getting working class placements and middle class pupils experiencing the benefits of 'professional placements'. The NEIC work experience placement programme is a conscious effort to combat this trend and is one strand in a coordinated effort to open doors, raise awareness and aspirations and ultimately to provide students in Dublin 1 schools with access to and insight into professions and career paths outside their existing network.

In 2018 the NEIC Initiative placed almost 100 transition year students from 2 schools in Dublin 1 in high quality work experience placements across businesses and civil and public service organisations in Dublin 1 and Dublin 2. Based on the positive impact of the placements and feedback from students, schools and organisations the programme was extended to include all 6 DEIS schools in the NEIC area in 2019. This past school year 2023— 2024 we secured over 300 placements for 220 students across 90 organisations. Organisations included; PwC, Kennedy Wilson, Beauchamps, State Street, Bank of Ireland, A&L Goodbody, Mathesons, Brown Thomas, IAPI, Verve Marketing and Events, Central Bank, Linesight, HJ Lyons, An Garda Siochana, Dalata Group, Sports Against Racism Ireland (SARI), Bord Bia, The Department of Foreign Affairs, The Department of the Taoiseach, Solas, Policing Authority, St Pat's Mental Health Hospital, Enterprise Mobility, Irish Museum of Modern Art (IMMA) and much more.

The Ask

For the academic year 2024/2025 we are looking to secure high quality work experience placements for 330 students. The feedback from past students and organisations have been overwhelmingly positive and we are asking all businesses and civil public service organisations within Dublin to consider hosting a local Dublin 1 student on a work experience placement. We will partner with you in creating an engaging timetable for the week.

Can I host more than one placement student?

Yes, absolutely! Many organisations involved in the programme have hosted between 2—10 placement students across different departments.

How will I plan the work experience placement?

We are happy to assist you in planning an engaging work experience placement. We can provide you with sample timetables from previous placements, a short guide on the objectives of the placement and details about the students you will be hosting.

How long does a placement last?

Work experience placements typically last for 1 week. As many offices now operate in a hybrid environment we are also happy to discuss options with organisations that could only host a student on site for 3 days.

Do I need insurance to host a student on placement?

Students are covered by their School Insurers. You will receive the student's insurance documents prior to their placement week.

What support will be available?

The NEIC Project Officer is available throughout the planning process and also during the placement to answer any questions you may have. Please see contact details below.

What is the goal of this placement?

The goal of the placement is to give students an insight into career areas and career paths they may not have considered or be aware of. The placement allows students to engage with individuals engaged in a variety of disciplines in the workplace. It also give them the opportunity to develop their communication and technical skills whilst also building their network and gaining an insight into potential career paths that may interest them, the day to day work involved in the career area and the entry requirements.
